

Planting a tree doesn't just lower your energy costs by up to 20%, it cleans the water, clears the air, and makes your neighborhood more enjoyable. The City of Concord, Carolina Power Partners, and All Saints' Episcopal Church, in partnership with the Arbor Day Foundation, are once again offering a limited number of free trees to homeowners through the Energy-Saving Trees Program.

Looking to add shade and beauty to your yard while lowering cooling costs? Concord residents can reserve a free tree through the City's Energy Saving Trees giveaway program! A total of 300 trees will be available this year, with eight varieties to choose from, including Red Maple, White Oak, Bald Cypress, and more.

Key dates to know:

- Reservation site opens: September 8 at 8 a.m. (sign up early—trees go fast!)
- Tree pickup: Saturday, October 18 at All Saints Episcopal Church in Concord (pickup times assigned upon reservation).

Thank you to all who attended the August 13, 2025, Historic Preservation Commission (HPC) public input meeting regarding the Logan Neighborhood's nomination to the National Register of Historic Places.

The HPC will hold a vote next month to decide whether to proceed with the nomination. If approved, the nomination will then be reviewed by the National Register Advisory Committee in October.

Did you know stormwater is simply rainwater that doesn't soak into the ground? As it flows across streets, sidewalks, and parking lots, it travels into storm drains and eventually into our local lakes, rivers, and streams, picking up pollutants along the way.

You can help protect our water quality by:

- Picking up litter and pet waste
- Properly disposing of chemicals, paints, and food waste
- Never dumping anything down a storm drain
