CONCORD CITY COUNCIL 2nd WORK SESSION MEETING SEPTEMBER 24, 2024

The City Council for the City of Concord, North Carolina, held the City Council 2nd Work Session in the 3rd floor City Hall Council Chambers located at 35 Cabarrus Ave, W, on September 24, 2024, at 11:00 a.m. with Mayor Pro-Tem Hubbard presiding.

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Mayor Pro-Tem Hubbard called the meeting to order

Quarterly Sewer allocation

Council Member McKenzie explained that Council Members rank each project from 0-5 prior to the quarterly allocation meeting. He stated the Council agreed that projects ranking 2.75 and above would be considered for approval.

A motion was made by Council Member Crawford and seconded by Council Member Langford to approve the following projects that ranked 2.75 and above for allocation:

Non-Residential Save the Children CarMax Auto Superstore Honda & Toyota of Concord Expansion Mosaic Concord #3: Interior Renovation Concord Parkway Retail Development

<u>Public</u> Hartsell Park David Phillips Park CCS Opportunity School The Council requested staff present amended verbiage to the staff's ranking description in the Allocation Policy at the October 22, 2024 2nd Work Session.

Consider authorizing the Planning and Neighborhood Development Services to apply for the McGill Redevelopment Project grant.

The Community Development Manager, Mary Carr, explained the \$50,000 grant application is due October 1, 2024.

A motion was made by Council Member Langford and seconded by Council Member McKenzie to authorize the Planning and Neighborhood Development Services to apply for the McGill Redevelopment Project grant—the vote: all aye.

Update – Afton Village sewer allocation

The Planning and Neighborhood Development Services Director, Steve Osborne, stated Afton Village began construction in the 1990's. He stated five (5) townhomes were constructed without sewer allocation. This error was not caught until after construction was complete. In the early 2000's, there were a large block of townhomes constructed incorrectly as platted. The plat was eventually corrected.

In March, the Council approved allocation for 33 single-family homes. Staff is recommending to shift allocation from 5 of those single-family homes to the five townhomes. Therefore, Afton Village may submit a sewer allocation for the December allocation meeting to request allocation for the five single-family homes.

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There being no further business to be discussed, a motion was made by Council Member Langford and seconded by Council Member Clay to adjourn—the vote: all aye.
