

What is the Summer Youth Police Academy?

The City of Concord Police Department is excited to provide the residents of Concord ages 12-16 with an opportunity to learn more about the Concord Police Department and the services we provide to the community. Youth participating in the four-day academy program gain firsthand information about the function and operations of the Concord Police Department through lectures and practical exercises.

What is the purpose of the Summer Youth Police Academy?

The academy is designed to increase understanding between youth and police officers through hands-on education. Our goal is to have youth understand police officers' role in the community, in the criminal justice system and to provide an insight into the issues faced by police officers daily.

What topics will be covered and what will participants learn?

The students will be learning about officers and what they do while learning team building skills. The students will get to see a few of our special units do demonstrations. The students will be broken into High School and Middle School groups to learn about different topics concerning their age group.

Throughout the academy participants will be encouraged to ask questions and discuss topics with the officers and instructors.

Who will be teaching at the academy?

All instructors will be sworn officers and staff from the Concord Police department who have expertise in the topic they will be teaching. We occasionally have special guests from the B.R.A.K.E.S. program come speak to the kids about car and road safety.

Who can apply?

The academy is open to all City of Concord youth between the ages 12-16. Participants are encouraged to submit their application early due to class size being capped at thirty.



When and where will the Academy be held?

The academy will be held Monday, June 3, 2024, through June 6. 2024. The check-in for the academy will begin at 8:30 AM and will end at 4:00 PM.
