The <u>Neighborhood Matching</u> <u>Grant</u> awards up to \$3,000 in matching grant funds to eligible recognized neighborhood organizations. The goal of the program is to



facilitate neighborhood self-improvement. All projects are initiated, planned and implemented by neighborhood members. Please read the **program policy** to see if your neighborhood's project is eligible for submission.

Deadline for applications is Monday, May 16, 2022 at 5 p.m.



Be among the first to view the new exhibition and meet the artist.





Golf Cart Safety

Summer trips to the pool are fun! Many neighborhood pools will be opening this month, but remember, leave you golf cart at home. Instead, safely walk or drive your vehicle to your neighborhood amenities. The City of Concord's local ordinance does not allow golf carts to be operated inside the city limits. The penalty for doing so could result in a Class 2 misdemeanor. The exception to this rule is for on-duty city employees on streets where the speed limit is 35 mph or less.

To learn about the types of vehicles that are allowed on our roadways <u>read the North</u> <u>Carolina General Statute</u> pertaining to low-speed vehicles, modified utility vehicles and mini trucks <u>here.</u>

Help us avoid golf cart accidents this year and keep your golf cart off the road.




Get to know your neighbors and join the Nextdoor community!
