Renovations & Revitalization of Historic Coleman Mill Underway









Earlier this week, Mayor Dusch, members of Council, and City staff toured the Coleman Mill project. The historic renovation and revitalization of the Coleman Mill, located at 625 Main St SW in Concord, will create 144 affordable apartments. The mill was originally built by Warren C. Coleman in the late 1800's and was the nation's first African-American owned and operated textile mill.

One of the most exciting discoveries during construction so far has been the uncovering of a decorative compass in the flooring that looks very similar to the one being placed in the Cabarrus Avenue and Union Street intersection in Downtown Concord. The architect reconfigured the plans to bring the front door of the complex to where the compass is so it can be on display for years to come.

Transportation Needs




