## **Annual Street Preservation & Resurfacing**



The City of Concord's annual street preservation project is now underway, beginning with a portion of Union Street South. Over the next six months, more than 30,000 tons of asphalt will be laid across 17.3 lane miles of city streets.

Work on Union Street South (from Tulip Ave SW to Rollingwood Dr SE) starts this week and will occur weekdays between 8 a.m. and 4 p.m., weather permitting. Expect temporary lane closures, traffic shifts, and no on-street parking in the work area during work hours. Crews will maintain driveway access, with brief delays possible.

Trash, recycling, bulky trash and yard waste services will continue as scheduled, place bins curbside by 6 a.m. to avoid missing your collection and keep carts and debris out of the road.

Areas included in the street preservation contract work include:

- Union St North & South
- Portions of Market Street and Spring Street in Downtown Concord
- Portions of the Logan Community (Young Ave SW & Crowell Dr SW)
- Portions of the Sheffield Manor neighborhood
- Portions of the Kings Crossing neighborhood



## **MONTHLY TIPS**



Planning to wash your car before you head out for summer vacation?

Many soaps used to wash cars contain ingredients known to pollute our stormwater system and can be harmful to aquatic life. If you're planning to wash your car soon, follow these important steps to ensure you're keeping soaps and pollutants out of our local waterways:

- Use an environmentally-friendly, biodegradable soap.
- Wash your car in the grass instead of in your driveway to prevent contaminates from going into a nearby storm drain.
- When possible, take your car to a car wash where water is properly drained or treated after it's used and doesn't end up in a local storm drain.
