


National Night Out

RECOMMENDED BUDGET OVERVIEW






For a home valued at \$357,000, annual City property taxes = \$1,500

During their June 13th Regular Meeting, City Council adopted the Fiscal Year (FY) 2025 budget. The city-wide budget is \$353,849,526 for all funds, including utilities and special revenue bonds. The budget includes a 6-cent cut to the property tax rate - dropping the rate from 48 cents to 42 cents per \$100 of valuation. With this, the annual City property taxes for a home valued at \$356,350 (the median single-family assessed home value for Cabarrus County) would be \$1,496.67.

This budget focuses on keeping our quality of life high. It includes plans to improve our parks and greenways, make traffic flow better, and increase affordable housing.

Language Access Plan



The City of Concord recently adopted a Language Access Plan (LAP) to address communication barriers and enhance services to our diverse community.

We were one of nine municipalities accepted into the inaugural Language Access Collaborative program, facilitated by the Building Integrated Communities team at the Institute for the Study of the Americas at UNC-Chapel Hill. We worked with El Puente Hispano to develop the plan and through the program evaluated our current practices and policies, conducted a needs assessment, and created a plan to improve communication with residents with Limited English Proficiency.

Over the next year, with support from grant funding through the Language Access Collaborative, the City will begin implementing goals from the LAP. These goals include:

- Increase translation of vital documents and notices, beginning with the three strategic languages - Spanish, Hindi, and American Sign Language.
- Provide interpretation services for residents, as requested, during public meetings.
- Develop internal training to share language access resources, requirements, and services.
- Create an inclusive emergency response plan.




Bagging your recyclables? Time to quit!

Reminder: Cabarrus Ave & Union St Intersection is Closed for Construction



Reminder! The intersection of Cabarrus Ave and Union St is closed as part of the Downtown Concord Streetscape Project. The closure began on May 20th and is expected to last two months, weather-dependent, while contractors work on the streetscape and update existing utilities.

During the closure, the Municipal Parking Deck remains accessible from both the Cabarrus Ave and the Union St entrances and drivers may still use Market St to visit downtown businesses or access the City's payment drop box.
