Help Us Design the New Les Myers Park Mural


A new public art project is coming to Les Myers Park and the community can help guide the mural design by participating in the brief online survey. The City of Concord Public Art Commission is working on the City's first Council-commissioned mural and wants it to reflect the values, interests, and aesthetics of the community. To accomplish this, the Commission needs to hear from residents.

The online survey is available *here* and closes end of day on Sunday, November 17.

The new mural at Les Myers Park will go on the existing tennis wall that is visible to Lawndale Avenue and adjacent to the upper parking lot and tennis courts. The mural is anticipated to be completed in May 2025.

## **Water & Sewer Authority of Cabarrus County**



#### Lake Don T. Howell Water Level Lowered for Maintenance

The Water & Sewer Authority of Cabarrus County (WSACC) has lowered the water level at Lake Don T. Howell by about five feet to complete planned maintenance on the dam. This work started in early November and will take about two months. Once done, the lake will return to its normal water level.

This maintenance is not due to recent weather or damage but is a proactive step to keep

the dam safe and working properly. The dam is inspected regularly, with the most recent inspection completed on June 6, 2024.
