
# Only A few Trees Remaining - Get Yours Before They're Gone!

### Concord Historic Preservation Commission Advances Logan Community's Bid for National Historic Recognition



Thank you to everyone who attended the August 13, 2025, Historic Preservation Commission (HPC) public input meeting regarding the Logan

Neighborhood's nomination to the National Register of Historic Places.

On Wednesday, September 10, the City of Concord Historic Preservation Commission unanimously voted to advance the Logan Community's application for listing in the National Register. The commission determined that the Logan Community meets the criteria for inclusion on the Register. This important milestone is a celebration of preserving the history and heritage of the Logan Community for generations to come.

The next step is review by the National Register Advisory Committee at its October meeting. If approved, the state historic preservation officer will sign the nomination before forwarding it to the National Park Service for final consideration.
